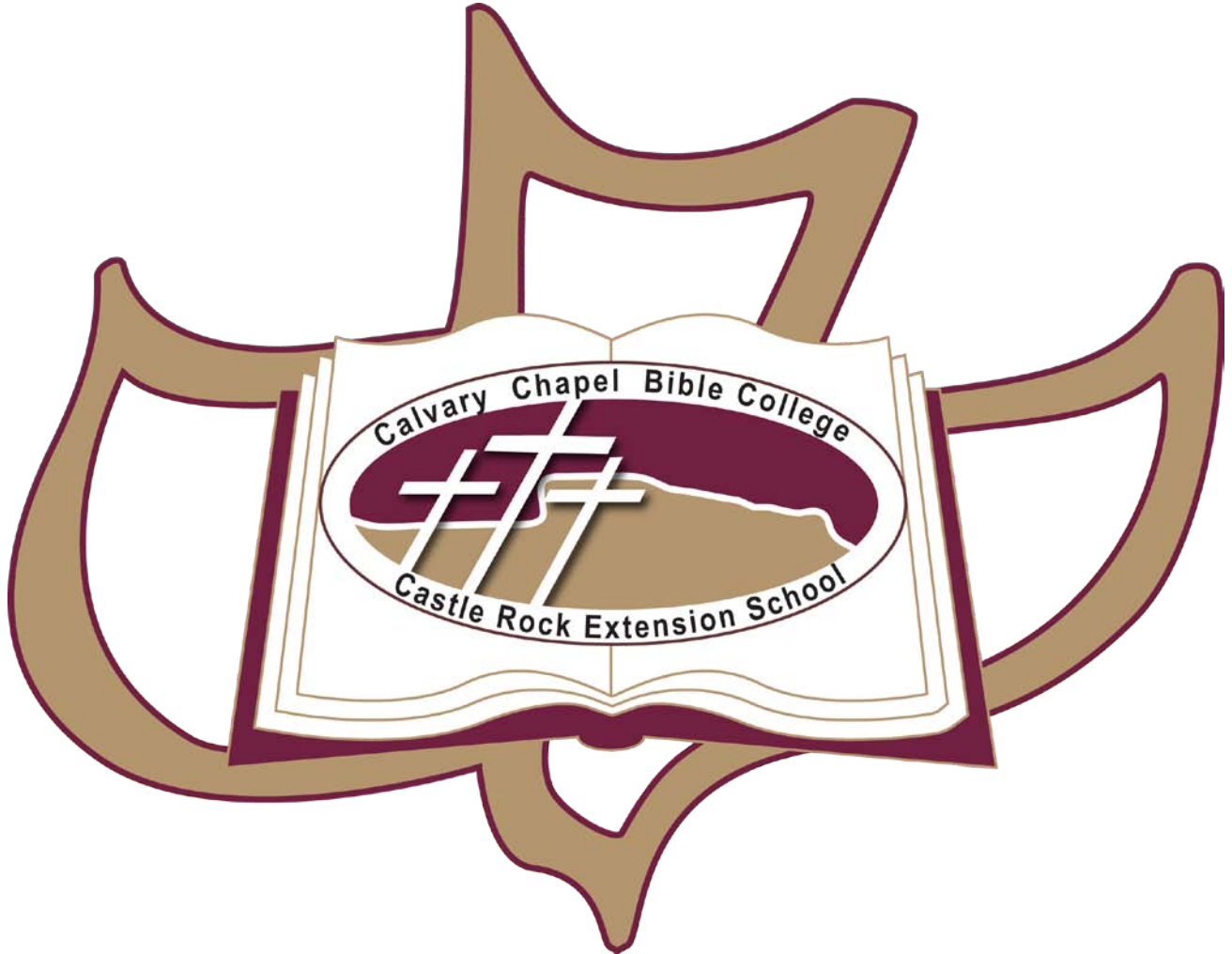

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

Calvary Chapel has been formed as a fellowship of believers in the Lordship of Jesus Christ. Our supreme desire is to know Christ and to be conformed into His image by the power of the Holy Spirit. We are not a denominational church, nor are we opposed to denominations as such, only their overemphasis of the doctrinal differences that have led to the division of the Body of Christ.

We believe that the only true basis of Christian fellowship is Christ's agape love, which is greater than any differences we possess, and without which we have no right to claim ourselves Christians.

We believe the worship of God should be spiritual. Therefore, we remain flexible and yielded to the leading of the Holy Spirit to direct our worship.

We believe the worship of God should be inspirational. Therefore, we give a great place to music in our worship.

We believe the worship of God should also be intelligent. Therefore, church services are designed with great emphasis upon teaching the Word of God, that He might instruct us.

We believe the worship of God should also be fruitful. Therefore, we look for His love in our lives as the supreme manifestation that we have truly been worshipping Him.

We believe in all the basic doctrines of historic Christianity. We believe in the inerrancy of Scripture, that the Bible, Old and New Testament, are the inspired, infallible Word of God.

We believe that the one God is eternally existent in three distinct persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

We believe that God is the personal, transcendent, and sovereign Creator of all things.

We believe that Jesus Christ is fully God and fully human, that He was born of a virgin, lived a sinless life, provided for the atonement of our sins by His substitutionary death on the cross, was bodily raised from the dead, ascended to the right hand of the Father, and ever lives to make intercession for us.

We believe in the personal, visible and pre-millennial second coming of Jesus Christ to the earth. He will return with His saints and set up a kingdom of which there will be no end.

We believe that after Jesus ascended to Heaven, He poured out His Holy Spirit on the believers in Jerusalem, enabling them to fulfill His command to preach the gospel to the entire world, an obligation shared by all believers today.

We believe that all people are, by nature, separated from God and are responsible for their own sin, but that salvation, redemption, and forgiveness are freely offered to all by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. When a person repents of sin and accepts Jesus Christ as personal Savior and Lord, trusting only Him to save, that person is immediately born again and sealed by the Holy Spirit, all his/her sins are forgiven, and that person becomes a child of God, destined to spend eternity with the Lord.

We believe in the gifts of the Holy Spirit mentioned in the Scriptures, and that they are valid for today if they are exercised within scriptural guidelines. We as believers are to covet the best gifts, seeking to exercise them in love that the whole Body of Christ might be edified.

We believe that love is more important than the most spectacular gifts, and without this love all exercise of spiritual gifts is worthless.

While Calvary Chapel Bible College holds to these beliefs, we welcome any believer in the Lord Jesus Christ who has a sincere desire to grow closer to Jesus. Our desire is to share in the fellowship of Christ in a way that brings glory to God, avoiding division, and to share in His Agape love.

AFFILIATION

Calvary Chapel Bible College Castle Rock Extension School is affiliated with the Calvary Chapel Bible College in Murrieta, CA, a ministry of Calvary Chapel of Costa Mesa where Chuck Smith is the pastor. All members of the Bible College staff are ministers of Calvary Chapel, under the direction of the staff of Calvary Chapel Castle Rock.

ACCREDITATION

Calvary Chapel Bible College is a unique, unaccredited, religious-exempt institution that offers a Bachelor's Degree in Biblical Studies and an Associate's Degree in Theology under the Bureau for Private Post Secondary and Vocational Education (School code: 3602671). We are not accredited, nor are we seeking accreditation, so as to be free from outside control and remain open to the leading of the Holy Spirit.

We desire to continue in our independent standing so as not to compromise the integrity of the vision or direction the Lord has given to CCBC. We believe that the credibility of CCBC is not in accreditation, but in the fruitfulness and surrendered lives of the students who have attended. *"Do we begin again to commend ourselves? Or do we need, as some others, epistles of commendation to you or letters of commendation from you? You are our epistle written in our hearts, known and read by all men."* (2 Cor. 3:1-2)

Calvary Chapel Bible College is known as a solid Bible-teaching college, our credits are transferable to many Christian colleges around the country. They have reserved the right not to accept certain credits as they deem appropriate. If you have specific questions about transferability of credits, call the Registrar's Office of the institution you desire to attend.

PURPOSE AND VISION

FINANCIAL AID

At Calvary Chapel Bible College, we attempt to keep the cost affordable for more students to attend. We do not participate in government-supported financial aid programs or guaranteed student loans.

REFUND POLICY

Prior to the first day of classes, students are eligible for a full refund of tuition. On or after the first day of classes, refunds are given according to the following schedule. During the 6th-16th week there is no refund given. If a student leaves during this time they will still be liable for the entire tuition.

ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

NEW STUDENTS

Degree Students If you are working towards a college degree, you must submit a complete New Credit Student Application Packet with three personal references along with a non-refundable application fee of \$25.

Audit Students If you are NOT seeking a degree and want to be an audit student, you must submit the New Audit Student Application form and a signed Doctrinal Statement of Calvary Chapel. You are not required to pay an application fee.

The Admissions decision is made by our Admissions Review Board on the basis of the following (Note: Not all of the following apply to Audit students.):

Spiritual Maturity

Information contained in the application is thoroughly evaluated. This includes the student's Personal Life Profile, Spiritual Life Profile, and Statement of Faith.

Personal References

References are required from three sources, one of whom must be a pastor. We also ask that they be from people who have known the applicant for at least one year, and are not related by blood or marriage.

Academic Preparedness

Evidence of completion of high school or a G.E.D. Program. If the student does not provide this information before admission, he or she will be automatically enrolled in the Certificate of Completion Program (some exceptions may apply), which cannot later be upgraded to a Degree Program. (The Certificate of Completion Program is intended for the non-high school graduate.)

Home Schooled Students

Home-schooled students who wish to pursue a degree will need to provide an official record of completion from their home school association.

Once all of the application materials have been received by the college, the student is usually notified of a decision within a few weeks. Please submit your application one month prior to the semester start to allow for review and processing.

Registration

Students are to register during the scheduled registration days. Students will receive credit through the Office of the Registrar.

Withdrawal

Official Withdrawal from enrollment to the college is made by submitting a completed Withdrawal Form to the Registrar's Office. Students may only withdraw until the end of the fifth week of the semester.

Students who drop out of class after the 5th week will receive grades of 'UW' or 'F' for their courses. Students departing the College for longer than one year will be required to follow the current catalog at the time of their readmission. Students may petition for an exception.

Student's Records

Enrollees are advised that CCBC maintains school and student records for no longer than five years beyond the student's final term of enrollment, with the exception of transcripts and academic records.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

Students desiring to transfer credits from an evangelical Bible college or seminary in order to fulfill a portion of their CCBC elective requirements should have Official Transcripts sent to the Admissions Office at CCBC along with a catalog containing the college's Statement of Faith and the course descriptions.

Other students may wish to transfer to CCBC with general education. If the student has a completed Bachelor of Arts Degree, or an Associate of Arts Degree in Liberal Arts, from an approved/accredited college or university with a grade of 'C' or better, he or she may pursue the Bachelor of Biblical Studies here at CCBC.

Students interested in transferring with an existing degree should have official transcripts and a copy of their diploma sent to the Admissions Office at CCBC, with the request that a complete evaluation be performed. Evaluations are not automatically performed. If, as a result of the evaluation, the student falls short of the required course work, they can then take the necessary courses at a local community college concurrently.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM

We offer three programs, Bachelor of Biblical Studies, Associate in Theology, and a Certificate of Completion program for you to choose from, as detailed below.

Bachelor of Biblical Studies

The Bachelor of Biblical Studies is a two-year program for students who have completed an Associate of Arts degree or higher-level degree at another college. Acceptance is conditional upon submission of official college transcripts which show evidence of their earned degree, and a copy of that school's catalog. The Bachelor of Biblical Studies degree consists of 80 semester credits earned at CCBC, combined with the Associate of Arts degree or higher.

Associate in Theology

The Associate in Theology is a two-year program intended for students who have completed high school, a G.E.D. Program, or the equivalent. Students must take all the required courses at Calvary Chapel Bible College and pass them with a grade of C- or better.

Certificate of Completion

The Certificate of Completion Program is a course of study intended for students who are not prepared for college-level academics or are not high school graduates. Some of the students who choose this program are those with learning disabilities or those for whom academics are extremely difficult. The spiritual training in this program is identical to that of the Associate in Theology and the Bachelor in Biblical Studies. In the Certificate Program, the students complete the courses on a Pass/Fail basis and are required to attend classes 100% of the time and complete assignments to a passing standard. Students must receive a grade of 'P' in all classes. A total of 80 credits must be earned by the student. Students walk through the graduation ceremony and receive the Certificate of Completion just as a degree student.

AUDIT PROGRAM

Students who desire to grow spiritually without earning credits may apply for the Audit Program. Audit students are required to do homework and are expected to attend all classes. Audit students do not earn credit and do not earn a certificate or degree of any kind.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

80 semester credits must be completed with a passing grade of C- or above to graduate. A maximum of 60 credits may be taken at CCBC Castle Rock and applied towards graduation. The other 20 credits must be taken through the main campus in Murrieta, California, either onsite, or through their online program found at: www.calvarychapelbiblecollege.com

In order to graduate, students must also participate in an Evangelistic Outreach at some point while attending CCBC or its affiliates and submit an Evangelistic Outreach form during the graduation process.

Note: It is the responsibility of the student to track his or her progress toward a degree through the use of the graduation worksheet available from the Registrar's Office.

Graduation Procedures

Potential graduates must sign up for a graduation interview with the Director when they register for their last semester. They will review records, resolve academic conflicts, verify degree level, and complete a petition to graduate during the graduation interview. In addition, we will schedule the graduation ceremony rehearsal and various meetings for the graduates at that time. This must be completed no later than the 8th week of the final semester for that student.

Graduation Policy

Calvary Chapel Bible College trains persons for Christian ministry and leadership; demanding a high standard of character and conduct, as measured by the Scriptures. Students who by the evaluation of the faculty and administration do not demonstrate these qualities during their degree or certificate program will not be recommended for graduation.

Students must be recommended by the faculty to obtain graduate status prior to graduation. Fulfillment of degree requirements does not guarantee a recommendation to graduation. Calvary Chapel Bible College reserves the right to dismiss students at any time for any reason deemed appropriate by the administrative staff. Prior to degree completion, the student may be required by Calvary Chapel Bible College to furnish additional and/or updated information to ensure accuracy and a complete file.

Calvary Chapel Bible College does not ordain ministers or directly place graduates in ministry positions outside the College. Occasionally, when Christian ministries announce openings for positions, the College makes the information available to students to apply for these positions if they wish to do so. However, making this information available does not constitute an endorsement of any ministry by the College.

SEMESTER SCHEDULE INFORMATION

Calvary Chapel Bible College operates on a 15-week semester schedule. One semester credit hour equals one hour of class instruction, plus approximately one hour of homework. For example, a two-credit class has approximately 30 hours of classroom instruction plus 30 hours of homework over the 15-week semester.

* Bible electives (elective classes that are a book(s) of the Bible) are usually 2 or 3 credits each.

** Practical Christian Ministry credits represent 60 hours per credit. 4 semesters are required for graduation.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Core Classes

Acts: The book of Acts is a verse-by-verse expositional study of the entire book of Acts. Students will gain a better understanding of the early church and its growth and the practical function of the church, ministry, and missions. (3 credits)

Genesis: The book of Genesis is a verse-by-verse expositional study of the entire book of Genesis. Through this book of beginnings, students will learn the foundational truths of the origin of creation, man, sin, sacrifice, worship, languages, races and nations of the world, and redemption. (3 credits)

Gospel: Any gospel book or combination of gospel books may be taught to fulfill this requirement. This class will be a verse-by-verse expositional study. (3 credits)

Revelation: The book of Revelation is a verse-by-verse expositional study of the entire book of Revelation. Students will see Jesus revealed throughout the book, learn how the Old Testament prophets fit into the book of Revelation, and gain a better understanding of eschatology. (3 credits)

Romans: The book of Romans is a verse-by-verse expositional study of the entire book of Romans. Topics covered will include the sovereignty of God, salvation, predestination, sanctification, justification, free will, the Jews, the Gentiles, Israel, and the grace of God. (3 credits)

Apologetics: This class is designed to equip students to give a defense for the hope that is in them. It will include an examination and evaluation of the overall argument for the truthfulness of Christianity. Emphasis will be given to the nature of truth, existence of God, evil, hell, the reliability of the Bible, archaeology, deity of Christ, resurrection of Christ, and other elements that comprise the core doctrines of Christianity. (2 credits)

Church History: Church History is a class giving an overview of the major events, doctrines, and people who were used in the development of the Christian Church. (2 credits)

Inductive Bible Study/Hermeneutics: This class may be an Inductive Bible Study class or a Hermeneutics class (or both). An Inductive Bible Study class teaches students how to correctly observe, interpret, and apply the word of God. Students will gain a greater appreciation of scripture as they learn sound principles of exegetical Bible study and are equipped with the tools needed to study. Hermeneutics is the art and science of Bible interpretation. A hermeneutics class will introduce the student to basic principles for Bible study and Bible interpretation, focusing on a literal, historical-cultural, and grammatical approach to the Scriptures, looking also at the different genres presented in Scripture. (2 credits)

Missions: This class studies the Biblical basis and principles of missions. Using Paul, his epistles, and the book of Acts as an example of missionary work in the early church, a proper understanding of God's heart for missions, the purpose, preparation, and practical aspects of ministry will be discussed. (2 credits)

Theology: Theology is a course in which the main doctrines of the Christian faith are discussed. The student will learn the importance of studying theology and be further equipped to defend the Christian faith. Attention should be given to the theological role of theology, God, Christ, Holy Spirit, man, sin, salvation, church, and personal eschatology. (2 credits)

Old Testament & New Testament Surveys: The C2000 Series MP3s are recordings of Pastor Chuck Smith's "Through the Bible" messages delivered at Calvary Chapel of Costa Mesa. As students take these courses, they will study the Bible verse-by-verse from Genesis through Revelation by listening to the expository messages, answering the study questions in the course guide, and writing down personal notes from the teachings. In order to fulfill this requirement, students must complete the course guides provided by the Main Campus. The survey is broken down into four three-credit courses. Students will need to complete all four courses to graduate. (3 credits x 4 semesters = 12 credits)

Practical Christian Ministry: This class is an opportunity for practical ministry for each student. This is a one-credit class where one credit = 60 hours of ministry per semester or two credits for 120 hours of ministry per semester. In a 15-week semester, this breaks down to eight hours a week for two credits or four hours a week for one credit. Four semesters of Practical Christian Ministry are required for graduation regardless of credits. (1 credit x 4 semesters = 4 credits)

Bible Electives: A Bible elective is any book or books of the Bible taught as a verse-by-verse expositional study. These are generally two or three credits depending on the hours of lecture and homework. A total of 15 Bible elective credits are required for graduation. These do not include the Bible classes that are part of the Core Classes. If a student completes more than one Gospel class, additional gospel classes may be counted toward Bible electives. (15 credits)

Other Electives: Other elective classes may include Cults & World Religions, New Testament Greek, Children's Ministry, Church Planting, etc. Elective classes do not include things like English, Math, Drama, Biology, etc.

ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

Policy

CCBC requires 100 percent attendance for all classes taken by students. Classes are conducted in a manner that will encourage academic excellence and the growth of Christian character. The final authority for attendance rests with the Registrar.

Whenever an absence occurs (for any reason), the student must make up the class. In addition, any homework that was due the day of absence should be included as well. This must be completed and submitted within two weeks of the absence.

In the event of excessive absences due to illness and/or family emergencies*, the student may need to withdraw from school and return the following semester when the situation improves.

**Emergencies are handled on a case-by-case basis through the Registrar's Office.*

Tardies

Being tardy will affect academic Grade.

Note: Any grade below a C- cannot be credited toward a degree, as it is considered failing. W Withdrawal: Given during the first 5 weeks of classes, when a student officially withdraws from class. A W does not affect the student's GPA.

ACADEMIC PROBATION

Students whose cumulative GPA drops below 2.0, or whose previous semester GPA is below 2.0, are placed on academic probation for the following semester. Continued attendance at Calvary Chapel Bible College for these students is dependent upon meeting the following requirements:

1. 100% attendance in all classes.
2. Initial and follow-up meetings with a staff member for academic accountability.

Students who are unable or unwilling to raise their GPA the next semester will either be asked not to reapply or be changed to the Pass/Fail system (Degree of Completion program). Students who desire to continue toward a degree will be offered academic tutoring.

Further consequences of Academic Probation include:

- Automatic change to the Pass/Fail system after two consecutive semesters of Academic Probation.
- Denial of re-enrollment if there has been a problem with diligence in the Practical Christian Ministry class (CM199), attitude, discipline, or any other area of non-repentant hardness of heart.

Those denied re-enrollment will be eligible to reapply after a one-year probation period. Students must earn a grade of C or better in all required courses. Grades of D or lower will not be considered a passing grade for any required course. F is a failing grade. Any course in which a D or lower is received cannot be applied toward a degree or certificate.

EXTENSION CAMPUSES

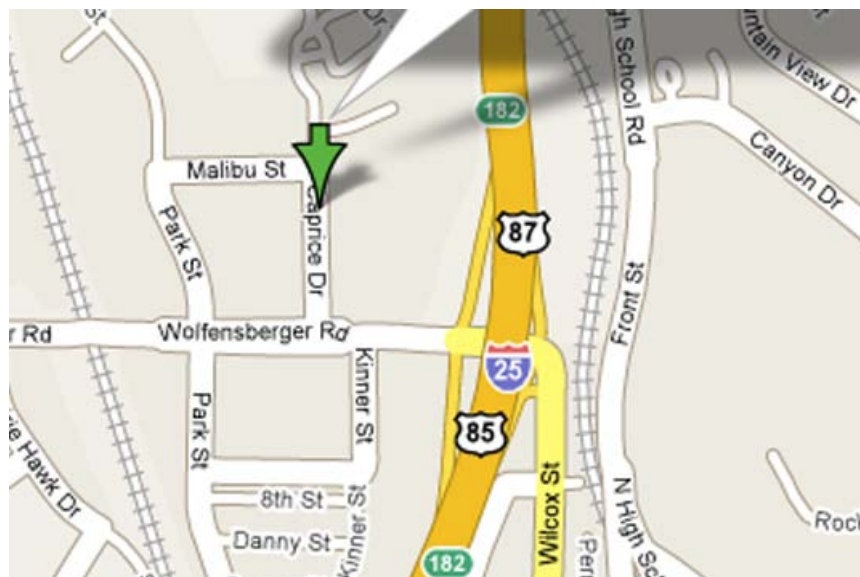
DRIVING DIRECTIONS
