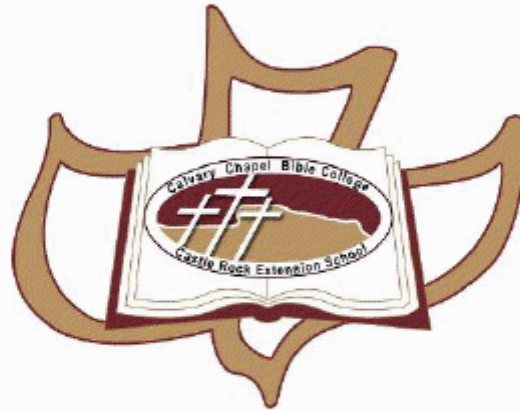

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

Calvary Chapel has been formed as a fellowship of believers in the Lordship of Jesus Christ. Our supreme desire is to know Christ and to be conformed into His image by the power of the Holy Spirit. We are not a denominational church, nor are we opposed to denominations as such, only their overemphasis of the doctrinal differences that have led to the division of the Body of Christ.

We believe that the only true basis of Christian fellowship is Christ's agape love, which is greater than any differences we possess, and without which we have no right to claim ourselves Christians.

We believe the worship of God should be spiritual, therefore, we remain flexible and yielded to the leading of the Holy Spirit to direct our worship.

We believe the worship of God should be inspirational. Therefore, we give a great place to music in our worship.

We believe the worship of God should also be intelligent. Therefore, church services are designed with great emphasis upon teaching the Word of God, that He might instruct us.

We believe the worship of God should also be fruitful. Therefore, we look for His love in our lives as the supreme manifestation that we have truly been worshipping Him.

We believe in all the basic doctrines of historic Christianity. We believe in the inerrancy of Scripture, that the Bible, Old and New Testament, are the inspired, infallible Word of God.

We believe that God is eternally existent in three distinct persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

We believe that God is the personal, transcendent, and sovereign Creator of all things.

We believe that Jesus Christ is fully God and fully human, that He was born of a virgin, lived a sinless life, provided for the atonement of our sins by His substitutionary death on the cross, was bodily raised from the dead, ascended to the right hand of the Father, and ever lives to make intercession for us.

We believe in the personal, visible and pre-millennial second coming of Jesus Christ to the earth. He will return with His saints and set up a kingdom of which there will be no end. After Jesus ascended to Heaven, He poured out His Holy Spirit on the believers in Jerusalem, enabling them to fulfill His command to preach the gospel to the entire world, an obligation shared by all believers today.

We believe that all people are, by nature, separated from God and are responsible for their own sin, but that salvation, redemption, and forgiveness are freely offered to all by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. When a person repents of sin and accepts Jesus Christ as personal Savior and Lord, trusting Him to save, that person is immediately born again and sealed by the Holy Spirit, all his/her sins are forgiven, and that person becomes a child of God, destined to spend eternity with the Lord.

We believe in the gifts of the Holy Spirit mentioned in the Scriptures, and that they are valid for today if they are exercised within the scriptural guidelines. We as believers are to covet the best gifts, seeking to exercise them in love that the whole Body of Christ might be edified.

We believe that love is more important than the most spectacular gifts, and without this love all exercise of spiritual gifts is worthless.

While Calvary Chapel Bible College holds to these beliefs, we welcome any believer in the Lord Jesus Christ who has a sincere desire to grow closer to Jesus. Our desire is to share in the fellowship of Christ in a way that brings glory to God, avoiding division, and to share in His Agape love.

Important Notice: To study and graduate from Calvary Chapel Bible College, students need to be in essential agreement with the preceding doctrinal statement.

AFFILIATION

Calvary Chapel Bible College Castle Rock Extension School is affiliated with the Calvary Chapel Bible College in Murrieta, CA a ministry of Calvary Chapel of Costa Mesa where Chuck Smith is the pastor. All members of the Bible College staff are ministers of Calvary Chapel, under the direction of Pastor Brian Abeyta.

ACCREDITATION

Calvary Chapel Bible College is a unique, unaccredited, religious-exempt institution that offers a Bachelor's Degree in Biblical Studies and an Associate's Degree in Theology under the Bureau for Private Post Secondary and Vocational Education (School code: 3602671). We are not accredited, nor are we seeking accreditation, so as to be free from outside control and remain open to the leading of the Holy Spirit.

We desire to continue in our independent standing so as not to compromise the integrity of the vision or direction the Lord has given to CCBC. We believe that the credibility of CCBC is not in accreditation, but in the fruitfulness and surrendered lives of the students who have attended. "Do we begin again to commend ourselves? Or do we need, as some others, epistles of commendation to you or letters of commendation from you? You are our epistle written in our hearts, known and read by all men." (2 Cor. 3:1-2)

Calvary Chapel Bible College is known as a solid Bible teaching college, our credits are transferable to many Christian colleges around the country. They have reserved the right not to accept certain credits as they deem appropriate. If you have specific questions about transferability of credits, call the Registrar's Office of the institution you desire to attend.

PURPOSE AND VISION

We desire to see each student develop the humble heart of a servant, allowing the grace of God to shape and strengthen his or her life. (1 Pet. 5:5; Eph. 5:21; Titus 2:11-12; 2 Tim. 2:1).

FINANCIAL AID

At Calvary Chapel Bible College, we attempt to keep the cost affordable for more students to attend. We do not participate in government supported financial aid programs or guaranteed student loans.

We do look for opportunities to enable students to attend while getting the costs covered. Please contact the Director with any and all financial needs.

REFUND POLICY

Prior to the first day of classes, students are eligible for a full refund of tuition. On or after the first day of classes, refunds are given according to the following schedule. During the 6th-16th week there is no refund given. If a student leaves during this time they will still be liable for the entire tuition.

ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

NEW STUDENTS

If you are interested in attending Calvary Chapel Bible College, you must submit an application that includes three personal references along with a non-refundable application fee of \$25. The application may be obtained through downloading it from our web-site, or by writing or calling:

The Admissions decision is made by our Admissions Review Board on the basis of the following:

Spiritual Maturity

Information contained in the application is thoroughly evaluated. This includes the student's Personal Life Profile, Spiritual Life Profile, and Statement of Faith.

Personal References

References from three sources, one of whom must be a pastor. We also ask that they be from people who have known the applicant for at least one year, and are not related by blood or marriage.

Academic Preparedness

Evidence of completion of high school or a G.E.D. Program. If the student does not provide this information before admission, he or she will be automatically enrolled in the Certificate of Completion Program (some exceptions may apply), which cannot later be upgraded to a Degree Program. (The Certificate of Completion Program is intended for the non-high school graduate.)

Home Schooled Students

Home-schooled students who wish to pursue a degree will need to provide an official record of completion from their home school association.

Once all of the application material has been received by the college, the student is usually notified of a decision within a few weeks. Please submit your application one month prior to the semester start.

Registration

Students are to register in person during the scheduled registration days. Students will receive credit through the Office of the Registrar.

Withdrawal

Official Withdrawal from enrollment to the college is made by submitting a completed Withdrawal Form to the Registrar's Office. Students may only withdraw until the end of the fifth week of the semester.

Students who drop out of class after the 5th week will receive grades of 'UW' or 'F' for their courses. Students departing the College for longer than one year will be required to follow the current catalog at the time of their readmission. Students may petition for an exception.

Student's Records

Enrollees are advised that CCBC maintains school and student records for no longer than five years beyond the student's final term of enrollment, with the exception of transcripts and academic records.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

Students desiring to transfer credits from an evangelical Bible college or seminary in order to fulfill a portion of their CCBC elective requirements, should have Official Transcripts sent to the Admissions Office at CCBC along with a catalog containing the college's Statement of Faith and the course descriptions.

Other students may wish to transfer to CCBC with general education. If the student has a completed Bachelor of Arts Degree, or an Associate of Arts Degree in Liberal Arts, from an approved/accredited college or university with a grade of 'C' or better, he or she may pursue the Bachelor of Biblical Studies here at CCBC.

Students interested in transferring with an existing degree should have Official Transcripts and a copy of their Diploma sent to the Admissions Office at CCBC, with the request that a complete evaluation be performed. Evaluations are not automatically performed. If, as a result of the evaluation, the student falls short of the required course work, they can then take the necessary courses at a local community college concurrently.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM

We offer three programs, Bachelor of Biblical Studies, Associate in Theology, and a Certificate of Completion program for you to choose from as detailed below.

Bachelor of Biblical Studies

The Bachelor of Biblical Studies is a program for students who have completed an Associate of Arts degree or higher-level degree at another college. Acceptance is conditional upon submission of official college Transcripts which show evidence of their earned degree, and a copy of that schools catalog. The Bachelor of Biblical Studies degree consists of 80 semester credits earned at CCBC, combined with the Associate of Arts degree or higher.

Associate in Theology

The Associate in Theology is a program intended for students who have completed high school, a G.E.D. Program, or the equivalent. Students must take all the required courses at Calvary Chapel Bible College and pass them with a grade of C- or better.

Certificate of Completion

The Certificate of Completion Program is a course of study intended for students who are not prepared for college-level academics or are not high school graduates. Some of the students who choose this program are those with learning disabilities or those for whom academics are extremely difficult. The spiritual training in this program is identical to that of the Associate in Theology and the Bachelor in Biblical Studies. In the Certificate Program, the students complete the courses on a Pass/Fail basis and this requires the student to attend classes 100% of the time and complete assignments to a passing standard. Students must receive a grade of 'P' in all classes.

Also a total of 80 credits must be earned by the student. Students walk through the graduation ceremony and receive the Certificate of Completion just as a degree student.

Audit Program

Students who desire to grow spiritually without earning credits may apply for the Audit Program. Audit students are not required to do homework and must attend class at least 70% of the time in order to receive the grade of Satisfactory Audit (AU). Audit students do not earn credit and do not earn a certificate or degree of any kind.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

80 semester credits or more are required to graduate. The student can accomplish this in four years by enrolling in 7 units or more per semester. The Bible College recommends taking classes according to the semester schedule as outlined.

*It is the responsibility of the student to track his or her progress toward a degree through the use of the graduation worksheet available from the Registrar's Office.

Graduation Procedures

Potential graduates must sign up for a graduation interview with the Director when they register for their last semester. They will review records, resolve academic conflicts, verify degree level and complete a petition to graduate during the graduation interview. In addition, we will schedule the graduation ceremony rehearsal and various meetings for the graduates at that time. This must be completed no later than the 8th week of the final semester for that student.

SEMESTER/ANNUAL SCHEDULE INFORMATION

Calvary Chapel Bible College operates on a 14-week semester schedule. One semester credit hour equals one hour of class instruction, plus approximately one hour of homework. For example, a two credit class has approximately 30 hours of classroom instruction plus 30 hours of homework.

A student may not exceed 20 credits in one semester, there are no exceptions. The typical student should average approximately 7 credits per semester to graduate in four years.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Students will usually take four calendar years to complete the four semester, 80-credit program.

The abbreviations for the course divisions and course emphasis are as follows:

BC= Biblical Counseling	CH= Church History	CL= Christian Living
CM= Christian Ministry	ET= Ethics	LA= Language Studies
MI = Missiology	M = Ministry & Missions	NT= New Testament
OT= Old Testament	PT= Preaching/Teaching	R = Radio
TH = Theology	W = Worship	

*Note: All elective courses are not listed in the catalog, nor are all courses listed offered every semester.

BIBLICAL COUNSELING

BC301 Introduction to Biblical Counseling 2 Credits

This course will equip those who desire to be used by the Lord in counseling. Emphasis will be on the Biblical basis for counseling as well as the principles put forth by God's word in order to counsel effectively. Students will also learn to discern the difference between 'worldly' and Biblical counseling methods and theories.

CHRISTIAN LIFE AND DISCIPLESHIP

CL105 Community Worship (Required) 1 Credit

4 credits total required for graduation. Community worship can be fulfilled during regular Church service attendance at your home Church.

CL305 Growing in God's Grace (Required) 2 Credits

By grace you are saved through faith. Eph 2:8 This course is a study of God's grace toward us as His children. God's grace is unmerited favor and goodness to the undeserving.

CHRISTIAN MINISTRY

CM199 Practical Christian Ministry (Required) 1 Credit

4 credits required for graduation. Students will be required to complete 14 hours of ministry service hours, and 8 hours of practical service hours.

HISTORY

H301 Church History (Required) 2 Credits

This course is designed as an overview of the major events, movements, doctrines, and personages associated with the development of the Christian church.

MISSIONS

MI301 Theology of Missions (Required) 2 Credits

This course is an investigation of the biblical and theological basis for world missions as seen in both the Old and New Testament. Emphasis is on the nature and purpose of God, the operation of the trinity, and the mission of Israel and the Church to the nations of the world.

NEW TESTAMENT

NT301 New Testament Survey I (Required) 3 Credits

This course is a verse-by-verse study of the New Testament books of Matthew through Acts. It is an audio class in MP3 (CDs) format taught by Chuck Smith. This class is taken 3rd semester/year.

NT302 New Testament Survey II (Required) 3 Credits

This course is a verse-by-verse study of the New Testament books of Romans through Revelation. It is an audio class in MP3 format taught by Chuck Smith. This class is taken 4th semester/year.

NT351 Gospel of Matthew (Required) 3 Credits

This course will be a verse-by-verse study through the entire Gospel of Matthew. Emphasis will be on the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and His claim to be the Messiah.

NT354 Gospel of John (Required) 3 Credits

This course will be a verse-by-verse study through the Gospel of John. Students will study John's theology, Christology, and the relationship of Jesus' deity and humanity.

NT355 Acts (Required) 3 Credits

Students will study verse-by-verse through the book of Acts, examining the biblical model for both the church and missions. Emphasis will be on the early church, how it began, the struggles it had, and how this applies to us today.

NT356 Romans (Required) 3 Credits

This course will be a verse-by-verse study through the book of Romans. Considered to be the most systematic study of doctrine found in the Bible, this class will give students an understanding of the foundations of Christian theology.

NT369 Hebrews (Required) 3 Credits

This course will be a verse-by-verse study through the book of Hebrews. The emphasis of this course will be on comparing the Old Covenant and the New Covenant. Students will be brought into a deeper understanding of the relationship that is available with God through Jesus Christ as our Mediator.

NT377 Revelation (Required) 3 Credits

This course will be a verse-by-verse study through the book of the Revelation of Jesus Christ. The course will be studied from a pre-millennial, pre-tribulational point of view. Emphasis will be on the sequence of prophetic events and the consummation of this age.

NT407 Galatians/Ephesians (Required) 3 Credits

This course is a verse-by-verse study of the books of Galatians and Ephesians. Emphasis will be placed on the life of walking in the Spirit and the contents of the Christian's heavenly "bank account" which includes: adoption, acceptance, redemption, forgiveness, wisdom, inheritance, the seal of the Holy Spirit, life, grace, and citizenship.

NT409 Pastoral Epistles (Required) 3 Credits

This course will be a verse-by-verse study through I Timothy, II Timothy and Titus. Students will gain insight into biblical characteristics of pastors and church leaders and how the church should operate.

OLD TESTAMENT

OT301 Old Testament Survey I (Required) 3 Credits

This course is a verse-by-verse study of Genesis through Job. It is an audio class in MP3 format taught by Chuck Smith. This class is taken 1st semester/year.

OT302 Old Testament Survey II (Required) 3 Credits

This course is a verse-by-verse study of Psalms through Malachi. It is an audio class in MP3 format taught by Chuck Smith. This class is taken 2nd semester/year.

OT310 Genesis (Required) 3 Credits

This course is a verse-by-verse study through the book of Genesis. Special consideration will be given to the fundamental principals in the book, including creation of the universe, introduction of sin and the formation of Israel.

OT328 Psalms (Required) 3 Credits

This course is a verse-by-verse study through the book of Psalms. The objective is to show the students the beauty of the Hebrew poetry displayed in the psalms, and seeing the different types of psalms in the Bible.

OT332 Isaiah (Required) 3 Credits

This is a verse-by-verse study of the book of Isaiah. This class will consider the time and calling of Isaiah the prophet. We will look closely at the prophecies revealing the Messiah in His suffering and glory, as well as, the coming kingdom age.

OT336 Daniel (Required) 3 Credits

This course is a verse-by-verse study through the book of Daniel. Students will explore the historical context, the prophecies that have been fulfilled, as well as those yet to be fulfilled. Consideration will also be given to the life of Daniel and his example for all believers.

THEOLOGY & APOLOGETICS

TH160 Biblical Theology (Required) 2 Credits

This course will be a biblical study of the basic Bible doctrines. Our purpose will be a deeper relationship with the Lord, through consideration of fundamental doctrines of the Bible.

TH165 Bibliology 2 Credits

This course will explore the special nature and unique character of the Bible. Emphasis will be placed on enabling the student to understand the process God used to reveal the Scriptures and pass down the 66 books of the Bible to us in their present form.

TH311 History of Redemption 2 Credits

The two main objectives of this course are to 1) see the unity of the Bible as it presents God's plan of salvation throughout and 2) review the general content of the books of the Bible, looking at their integration and themes.

TH340 The Person & Gifts of the Holy Spirit 2 Credits

An examination of the presence and influence of the Holy Spirit throughout the Scriptures. This course will take an in-depth look at the attributes and the deity of the Third Person of the Trinity. Also providing detailed discussion of all spiritual gifts mentioned in the New Testament.

TH353 Creationism 2 Credits

Students will be shown the validity of the biblical view of creation. Including topics such as the six literal days of creation, the world wide flood, and methods of creation evangelism.

TH365 Apologetic Evangelism (Required) 2 Credits

Those who desire to reach the lost and answer their questions about the Bible and Christianity will benefit from this course. Topics included will be the existence of God, historical evidence for Christianity, and the reliability of the Scriptures.

TH370 Christology..... 2 Credits

This course covers the study of the doctrine regarding the Lord Jesus Christ. This course covers such topics as: the preexistence of Christ, the Messianic claims of Christ, the Deity of Christ, the death and resurrection of our Lord and more.

TH387 Cults & World Religions 2 Credits

An overview of the major cults and religions of this age. Emphasis will be on how to respond to these different groups and how to guide them to the truth of Christ.

TH417 Inductive Bible Study (Required) 2 Credits

This course is designed to teach students to dig into the Word of God in order to observe, correlate, interpret, and apply. In addition to understanding the biblical text, we will also learn how to verbally communicate the Word to others.

ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

Policy

CCBC requires 100 percent attendance for all classes taken by students. Classes are conducted in a manner that will encourage academic excellence and the growth of Christian character. The final authority for attendance rests with the Registrar.

Whenever an absence occurs (for whatever reason) the student must make up the class. For all absences, students need to fill out the Absence Authorization Form available in the Bible College Front Office. This form completed, along with the one page summary, is to be turned in to the Absence Authorization Box in the Bible College Front Office. In addition, any homework that was due the day of absence should be included as well. This must be completed and submitted within two weeks of the absence.

All Absences will incur a penalty.

In the event of excessive absences due to illness and/or family emergencies, the student may need to withdraw from school and return the following semester when his or her health improves.

*Emergencies are handled on a case-by-case basis through the Registrar's Office.

Tardies

Being tardy will affect academic Grade.

Note: Any grade below a C- cannot be credited toward a degree, it is considered failing. W Withdrawal: Given during the first 5 weeks of classes. When a student officially withdraws from class. A W does not affect the student GPA.

ACADEMIC PROBATION

Students whose cumulative GPA drops below 2.0, or whose previous semester GPA is below 2.0, are placed on academic probation for the following semester. Continued attendance at Calvary Chapel Bible College for these students is dependent upon meeting the following requirements:

1. 100% attendance in all classes.
2. Initial and follow-up meetings with a staff member for academic accountability.
3. Students who are unable or unwilling to raise their GPA the next semester will either be asked not to reapply or be changed to the Pass/Fail system (Degree of Completion program). Students who desire to continue toward a degree will be offered academic tutoring.

Further consequences of Academic Probation include:

- Automatic change to the Pass/Fail system after two consecutive semesters of Academic Probation.
- Denial of re-enrollment if there has been a problem with diligence in the CM199 class, attitude, discipline, or any other area of non-repentant hardness of heart.

Those denied re-enrollment will be eligible to reapply after a one year probation period. Students must earn a grade of C or better in all required courses. Grades of D or lower will not be considered a passing grade for any required course. F is a failing grade. Any course in which a D or lower is received cannot be applied toward a degree or certificate.

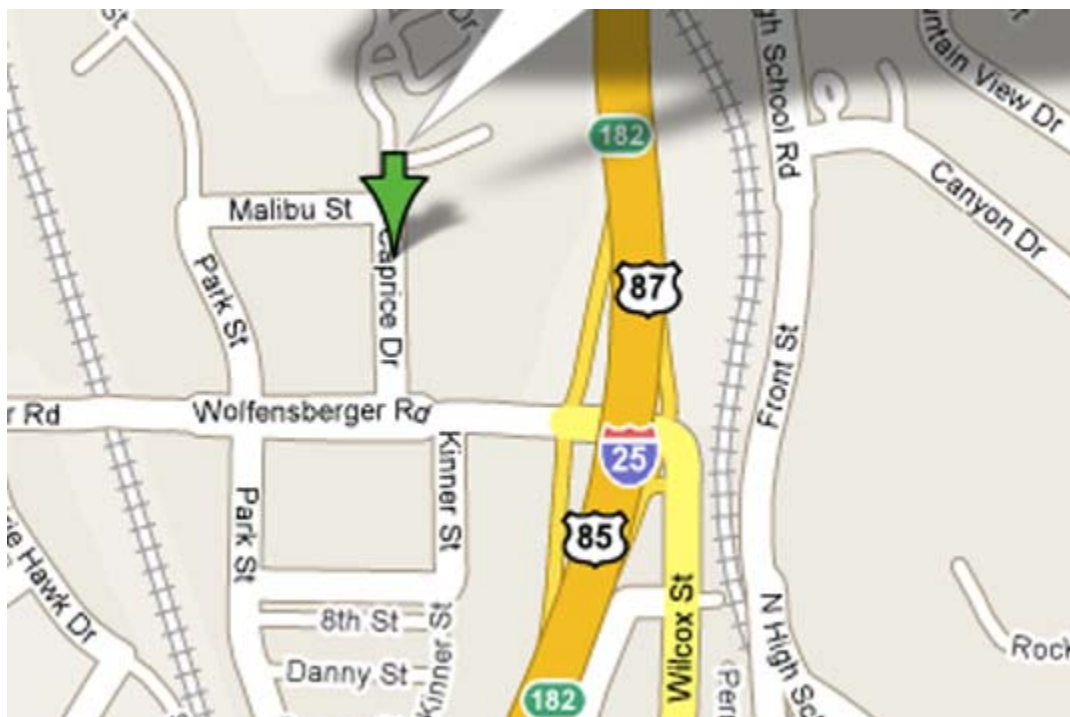
